INSTRUMENT OF RATIFICATION

WHEREAS, the duly authorised representatives of the Governments of the Member States of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations have signed the **Protocol (6): Railways Border and Interchange Stations** to the ASEAN Framework Agreement on the Facilitation of Goods in Transit, in Phnom Penh, Cambodia, on the Fifteenth Day of December, in the Year Two Thousand and Eleven;

AND WHEREAS, the Article 8 (4) of the Protocol (6) stipulates that the Protocol shall enter into force upon the deposit of Instrument of Ratification or Acceptance by all Contracting Parties with the Secretary-General of ASEAN;

NOW THEREFORE, the Government of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, having considered the Protocol, hereby ratifies the same and undertakes faithfully to perform and carry out all the stipulations contained therein;
