

INSTRUMENT OF RATIFICATION

WHEREAS the Protocol 1 on Unlimited Third and Fourth Freedom Traffic Rights between Any ASEAN Cities was signed at Bandar Seri Begawan, Brunei Darussalam, on 12 November 2010, by the duly authorised Representatives of the Governments of Brunei Darussalam, the Kingdom of Cambodia, the Republic of Indonesia, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Malaysia, the Union of Myanmar, the Republic of the Philippines, the Republic of Singapore, the Kingdom of Thailand and the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam;


WHEREAS Article 3, paragraph 2, of the Protocol stipulates that this Protocol is subject to ratification or acceptance by the Contracting Parties who have ratified or accepted the ASEAN Multilateral Agreement on the Full Liberalisation of Passenger Air Services;

WHEREAS Article 3, paragraph 3, of the Protocol stipulates that this Protocol shall enter into force on the date of the deposit of the third (3rd) Instrument of Ratification or Acceptance with the Secretary-General of ASEAN and shall become effective only among the Contracting Parties that have ratified or accepted it. For each Contracting Party ratifying or accepting the Protocol after the deposit of the third (3rd) Instrument of Ratification or Acceptance, the Protocol shall enter into force on the date of the deposit of such Contracting Party of its Instrument of Ratification or Acceptance; and

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF THAILAND, having considered the aforesaid Protocol, hereby confirms and ratifies the same and undertakes to faithfully perform and carry out all the stipulations contained therein.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, this Instrument of Ratification is signed and sealed by the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Thailand.
