INSTRUMENT OF RATIFICATION

WHEREAS the Second Protocol to Amend the Agreement Establishing the ASEAN-Australia-New Zealand Free Trade Area was signed in Semarang, Indonesia on 14 February 2024 by the duly authorised representative of the Government of the Kingdom of Thailand; and

WHEREAS Article 2, paragraph 1, stipulates that the Protocol shall be subject to ratification, acceptance or approval by each Party in accordance with its applicable legal procedures and the instrument of ratification, acceptance or approval of a Party shall be deposited with the Depositary, who shall promptly notify all other Parties of each deposit;

THE GOVERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF THAILAND, having considered the aforesaid Protocol, hereby confirms and ratifies the same and undertakes faithfully to perform and carry out all the stipulations therein contained.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, this Instrument of Ratification is signed and sealed by the Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Thailand.

DONE at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Bangkok, this 31st day of July in the Year Two thousand Five hundred and Sixty-eight of the Buddhist Era, corresponding to the Year Two thousand and Twenty-five of the Christian Era.
